Call to Order

Approval of Minutes

- The minutes were **unanimously approved**.

Treasurer's Report

Laura Vandegrift provided the following report in the absence of Keith Morrison:

- The financials for December 2022 and January 2023 were sent via email before the meeting.
 - Beth Adams made a motion to accept the financial reports as submitted, seconded by Byron Andrews
 - The Treasurer's Report and financials were **unanimously approved**

President's Report

President Nate Strong advised of the following:

Executive Director's Report

Ray Whatley, Acting Executive Director provided the following report in his absence:

- Ray is unable to attend the meeting today as he is attending the COG Regional Executive Development program.
- Ray has had two meetings with the Regional Executive Directors group since we last met with the focus on the Council work plan.
- Expect some changes to the Regional Award Program to make submissions easier.
 - We encourage you to start finding people to recognize now for next year.
- We want to recognize the efforts of all our regional award nominees. We had two that did win the Commonwealth's EMS Governors Award.
 - Outstanding Contribution to EMS Telecommunications - Adriane Heiden Loudoun County Fire and Rescue.
 - Outstanding Prehospital Educator - Penny Kelly Fairfax County Public Schools and Fairfax County Fire and Rescue.
 - Congratulations to all our award winners.
- Ray wants to thank Michelle, Laura, and Margaret for putting together the annual report. And a special shout out to Laura for putting it all together.
- The Audit has been completed and was sent to the BOD last week. Overall, we view this as a positive audit. We do have a few items and processes that we can improve on.
- FY23 Hospital Donation letters have been sent out, and we have received our first payment.
- The Council Workplan was sent to VDH for their final signature. It is scheduled to go into effect on January 1, 2023, once signed. We did see an increase to our base funding, with additional funding

for our stroke smart part-time position (transitioning Margaret to council funding rather than the previous grant funding), and for a regional educator(s).

- We still need additional information from the OEMS ACE division to see who can fill that role and what they need for documentation.
- FARC needs one representative from our region to serve a three-year term from July 2023 - July 2026 with the possibility of one three-year reappointment. We will need to submit three names to OEMS. Byron Andrews has previously served and has expressed interest again.
- Regional Paramedic Program is still ongoing behind the scenes. GWU School of Medicine and Medical Faculty Associates are still working through some processes. Expect an update around February.
- Triage tags discussion. The emergency management committee met on November 17. A workgroup has recommended adopting SALT and hopes to bring it to the EMSAB in early 2023. OMDs and different groups should voice their concerns in their respective groups.
 - VA and Maryland use START, and DC is using SALT.
 - After discussions with COG EMS, their recommendation is to leave the tag as is (START) without the gray option.
 - Byron – after some discussion sending back to the council directors, and OMD workgroup before they make a recommendation either way. Unsure of venue to submit questions/concerns but the Council will find out so everyone can voice their opinions

STATE AND REGIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Stroke Smart Advocate Report

Margaret Probst provided the following report:

- Since we last met on 10/20, Purcellville has issued its Stroke Smart proclamation. She is working with Council Member and Purcellville Business Association President Erin Rayner to bring the training to businesses in the town.
- Margaret was scheduled to meet with Fairfax's Supervisor Lusk on 10/25, but he had to reschedule for 11/30 and then rescheduled again. We're hoping that the third time is the charm and that our meeting scheduled for 1/5 in the new year happens. The supervisor has asked for some stroke data (we worked with the VDH for the numbers) and for the Stroke Smart training during that meeting.
- Even though we are still waiting for a proclamation from Fairfax County, significant training is happening there. Through Fairfax's CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) coordinator, Mr. Jeff Katz, several hundred people in Fairfax have been trained in October and November. Margaret also presented at this year's CERTCON in Alexandria. Margaret also presented to Fairfax library staff just a week with more training scheduled for the coming year for libraries. She also taught their MRC volunteers this past summer. We're excited to bring the Stroke Smart supplies (magnets, wallet cards, and posters) to the community through the libraries and know this is a great way to reach non-English speaking people.
- Margaret has been working with the National Federation of the Blind of Virginia (Potomac Chapter) to produce a Stroke Smart video useful to the blind and visually impaired. She has teamed up with their president and is ready to finalize the offering. It should be posted to the NVEMS website by the end of this quarter.
- Margaret trained several dozen health/PE teachers in Prince William County across all grade levels to be Stroke Smart, so they can bring the program to their students. Although the county

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has committed to bringing the program to their 8th and 9th graders only at this time, we do have introductions to the school administrator empowered with expanding the offering and are working on doing that. Over 3000 Stroke Smart supplies have been delivered to PW county schools. We also presented the training at a Health Event to members of the PW Chamber of Commerce and are now working with Sentara's Michele Eckhardt to bring the Stroke Smart message to the Hispanic communities they serve. Lastly, Margaret completed a short interview with the Spanish cable TV show based in PW county, Panorama Latino, to introduce the Stroke Smart information to their audience.

- Work continues through Arlington County with training being scheduled with their library and parks and rec departments.
- In the City of Fairfax, through an invitation from T. Olander, Margaret got to present to the members of Station 3.
- In the City of Manassas, we met with D. Keiling, the Coordinator of Physical Education, Health, and Driver Education, in advance of training all his teachers in January. He intends to roll out the Stroke Smart training to all grades in the City of Manassas.

AHA Training Center

Ray Whatley provided the following report:

- We are now able to send eCards directly to the eCard admins for each training site's eCard location.
- Life's Simple 7 has been changed to **Life's Essential 8** which are the key measures for improving and maintaining cardiovascular health, as defined by the American Heart Association. Better cardiovascular health helps lower the risk for heart disease, stroke, and other major health problems. This may serve as a good tool for community outreach messages. <https://www.heart.org/en/healthy-living/healthy-lifestyle/lifes-essential-8>
- PALS Advanced Life Support eLearning Modules Available

- Executive Committee (Nov 17)

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- Legislation & Planning (Nov 18)
 - Moving forward with EMS as an essential service legislation initiative
 - Discussion about the need for increased funding for EMS – encourage expediting GAB plan for needs assessment
 - Per Scott Winston: VA Hospital & Healthcare Association seeking to amend section 54.1-3408 currently says “persons trained to administer medications” and the change intends to allow the EMT/paramedic to provide med admin & skills in an ED or other medical facility. Per Dr. Jake O’Shea (VHHA rep to GAB) there is a desire to ensure that medics can practice at the ‘top of their license’ in or out of the hospital
- Advisory Board (Nov 18)
 - Approved recommendation from Advisory Board Composition workgroup
 - Support EMS as an essential service
 - Elevate OEMS to department status (caveat: director would become a political appointee)
 - Transition GAB to policy board (if OEMS becomes a department)
 - Approved 2023-2025 OEMS Strategic Plan
 - Completed by L & P committee at 9/23 special meeting
 - OEMS finalizing MOUs with regional councils
 - FARC: \$13.9 million / 79 applications (174 items) - meeting on 12/1
 - Approved letter from Medical Direction Committee re: endorsement of EMTALA standard (ref: NoVA facility issue re: current practice to hold EMS in the parking lot is wholly unacceptable)

City of Alexandria Fire Department

Chief Duke provided the following:

- He is filling in for DC Hricik and there is no report

Arlington County Fire Department

EMS Battalion Chief Anne Marsh provided the following update:

- Seeing an uptick in flu and RSV in peds and older population
- Many mandatory holds for the holiday season
- Incoming recruit school should help ease the pressure of staffing shortages soon
- Telehealth is going well
 - They're getting about 4 calls a day
 - They are no longer doing 1 am to 7 am as there were negligible calls during that time
 - Jail and sheriff's office are currently using them for telehealth to determine intake needs
- Dr. Smith added that they are moving forward in assisting the City of Fairfax Fire Department with the utilization of telehealth
 - Additionally, they are using it as psychiatric telehealth to clear patients remotely in the field to transport them directly to a psychiatric facility
- They are trying to establish a monetary system to compensate preceptors in Arlington for their work

City of Fairfax Fire Department

Brian Orndoff advised of the following:

- They are hoping to launch their whole blood program at the end of this month
 - They are still working on internal audit training
 - Thanks to Dr. Smith for helping them get that up and running
- They are close to getting their Community paramedic program running
 - This will be a paramedic, police co-responder team that will launch in July

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- It will mimic other police co-responder teams and then their community paramedic will f/u afterward
- Partnering to launch telehealth in conjunction with Arlington County in the January or February timeframe

Fairfax County Fire & Rescue

Mark Kordalski provided the following update:

- The current recruit school graduates tomorrow, another starts in January
- DC Lee Warner is replacing DC Kordalski in the office effective December 31, 2022

Fairfax County Police Helicopter Division

Paul DeHaven provided the following updates:

- Move-in date to West Ox has moved back again and will now likely be after the first of the year
- Their Tactical Medic Program joined the blood program, so they now have 2 full-time paramedics who will carry blood in addition to the units carried on the helicopter

Loudoun County Fire and Rescue

EMS Battalion Chief Jamie Cooper provided the following updates:

- They have rolled through the next iteration of their AEMT program
 - They pulled 10 highly performing recruits and took them from recruit school to the AEMT program
 - The last time they did this with 2 and it worked well
 - It's different this time with 10 vs. 2
 - They are seeing a continued high level of performance in those 10
 - Most of them have had prior experience in EMS, but not all
- They just started their first AEMT to paramedic upgrade
 - These students flew through class and the process
 - They saw these students as having a tremendous advantage with having a base level of practicality for an understanding of ALS skills vs going from EMT to P
- They put out a Regional informational bulletin a few weeks ago that they have equipped 5 engines in Loudoun to become ALS engines
 - This is a good opportunity for those promoted into officer positions and allows them to continue to use their ALS skills from an engine platform
 - This is also kicking off an EMS resource distribution program to be sure they have the best allocation of resources in the best places in the county
- They advertised for an abbreviated recruit school for those already with EMT and firefighter certifications
 - The class will be 16 weeks instead of 26
- They are also considering revamping the pay structure for those going into ALS classes and splitting the ALS incentive bonus to \$4000 for completion of AEMT and then \$6000 for completion of paramedic. If they go directly from EMT to paramedic, they will get the full \$10,000 at one time

City of Manassas Fire and Rescue

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John Bowers advised there was nothing to report.

- They graduated 8 recruits that will start in the field this week
- The new Fire Chief Eddie Mills starts on January 3, 2023
- They are looking into upgrading their CME program as they lost several trainers in the last year
 - Any suggestions are welcome
 - Ray to reach out about the hiring of a regional educator and how that can be of assistance to them

City of Manassas Park Fire & Rescue

James Tharp advised there was nothing to report.

MWAA

Chief Hubble:

- The CDC is screening for Ebola still
 - No PUIs so far
- They had 2 medics that recently completed training and are interning now and should be cut loose soon
- Acting Chief Rick Bonnett added that Gary Hubble turned 2 crash units into non-transport units with full BLS capabilities, thank you for the hard work – this helps until units arrive

Prince William County Fire and Rescue

Dr. Sullivan provided the following report:

- They have a paramedic class in clinicals now and they are doing well
- They will have another class starting next year
- They plan to announce the new fire chief in the next few weeks
- Chip Morrison added that recruit school with 42 in session and they have completed EMT and are starting firefighter now
 - They should graduate in early April
 - They will start a new school in March
- They are working on getting additional pay for FTOs

OEMS Program Representative

Chris Vernovai provided the following update:

- New contracts going through the signature process, they have ours for the Commissioner's signature, should be good 1/1/23
- Many different programs were very prescriptive in the contract making it hard to make modifications, etc., and had to go through a large process
 - Different programs are set up as programmatic guidance and will come from OEMS with requirements for what regional educator needs, how new regional awards are run, etc.

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- Currently working on a 4.5-year contract due to a 6-month extension and it will be up June 30, 2027
- Migrated all google accounts down for email and file sharing, and transferred to Outlook and MS office 365, everyone is trying to find everything now, lots of filters in place to keep things decluttered have been removed so it's been a challenge. Trying to filter and clean up for most of the office this week.
- Next meetings – last adv board as Beth stated, state EMS plan approved and next past, OEMS will present to the Board of Health and will then go into effect and be published on the website – no date announced yet. Likely February or March
- Most OEMS staff is on leave after this week until the new year

Inova Health System

Craig French advised of the following update:

- The Health System continues to have its emergency operations plan in effect.
 - No effect on the EMS system, it just allows them to have EOCs open each day at each hospital for patient surges, boarders, capacity levels
- On Monday of this week, they launched a centralized bed placement program in Epic with Mount Vernon being the first hospital to try it out
 - If a patient is admitted, normally they'd be admitted to the hospital they were in but because of surges, someone may come to one ED and either board in the ED until a bed is available or transfer to another available bed in another Inova hospital
 - Working well so far
- Steve Kling has started at Fairfax as the EMS Liaison

Reston Hospital Center

Tracey Taylor gave the following update:

- Keith Morrison is out on leave and should return after the first of the year
- They have a completely new trauma team over the last 6 months
 - They are trying to do some outreach like Stop the Bleed with some schools, and Dr. Wang, a trauma surgeon, is trying to get into the community for education or do quarterly dinners or come to the fire stations for trauma education
 - Their Trauma Educator is new also and recently attended the Matter of Balance program which focuses on strengthening, nutrition, and home safety in elderly populations
 - They are also looking to get into the community to teach that in the local area and to Fire and EMS
