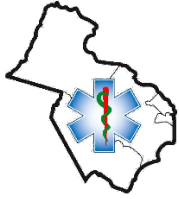

Call to Order

Council President Nate Strong welcomed all in attendance and called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

- No representatives from the public were present to address the Board.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the NVEMSC Board of Directors held on April 20, 2023, were sent for review by email

- Beth Adams made a motion to accept the minutes as written, seconded by Tom Olander
- The minutes were **unanimously approved**.

Treasurer's Report

Keith Morrison advised the financial reports were sent via email before the meeting for review.

- Beth Adams made a motion to accept the financial reports as submitted. The motion was seconded by Paul DeHaven
- The Treasurer's Report and financials were **unanimously approved**

President's Report

President Nate Strong advised of the following:

- Congratulations to Rick Bonnett, who was named the new Fire Chief at MWAA. He will be installed next week in his new position.
 - Rick has also agreed to serve as Immediate Past President on the Board of Directors since Anne Marsh has retired
- The FY2024 budget was approved by the Executive Board and was sent to all Board members by email for review. It will be presented during this meeting.

Executive Director's Report

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Ray Whatley reported the following:

- Currently working with the following Workgroups:
 - HB2175
 - Email survey sent to CAOs regarding funding and staffing sent. Input will be needed from Fire Chiefs.
 - Ambulance Patient Offload Times
 - OEMS has done a baseline data analysis and developed a foundational understanding of Virginia APOT calculations. As a result, we found some issues affecting APOT time calculation that span across all the stakeholders involved - ePCR vendors, EMS agencies, and receiving facilities.
 - 3 phases due to data discrepancies from no standardization with all vendors
 - 1st – All electronic patient care report (ePCR) vendors that are utilized in Virginia. (June 20)
 - 2nd – EMS Agency Leadership. This meeting will be conducted as a facilitated open forum call/webinar and will include invites to all licensed EMS agency leaders and ePCR software points of contact with agencies. (June 20-30)
 - 3rd – Hospitals / Receiving Facilities in Virginia. This meeting will be conducted as a facilitated open forum call/webinar and will include facility leadership, ED/ER Nurse Managers/Directors, EMS Liaisons, and Trauma Center Managers. (July 1 -17)
 - The Facilitator Group will have an initial meeting (scheduling survey below) and then a final meeting following the 3rd stakeholder group meeting.
 - APOT Facilitators to group development (July 17-August 1)
 - Goal to have final work product to EMSAB in August and VDH BOH in September
- We reconstituted the EMS-Pharmacy Committee
 - Currently tracking Ketamine shortage input needed from agencies
 - Epinephrine 30 mL change in vials
- Regional paramedic
 - Now under the GW School of Medicine
 - Start still planned for Fall 2023
 - Will launch even if desired student threshold is not met
 - Arlington 10
 - City of Manassas 1-2
 - Fairfax County Police 1
 - DC 4
 - At the Executive Board meeting, it was discussed - are there other program opportunities with less impact on instructors and equipment?
- Regional Councils, including hybrids, will now have an IT governance committee for procurement of technology devices and software
- We did receive a grant from Sentara for our Stroke Smart initiatives
 - Michelle will speak on this
- Regional Awards Program after our BOD meeting follows this meeting

STATE AND REGIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Stroke Smart Advocate Report

Michelle Ludeman presented the following update:

- Margaret submitted a grant through Sentara Cares, and we were awarded \$6500 for Spanish translation and video services for our Stroke Smart training
- Margaret Probst’s resignation is now effective in September, with limited hours until then
 - She is primarily completing training already scheduled until she leaves
- We have been asked to present at CERTCon
- Arlington County is doing Stroke Smart training
- We were able to get funding for 20,000 Stroke Smart magnets and a new computer with a monitor and docking station through a Coverdell grant
- We are going into year 3 with Coverdell with an additional \$10K for stroke smart

AHA Training Center

Ray Whatley provided the following report:

- AHA prices are being raised effective July 1. Please plan to place orders before June 28 to allow time for processing.
- AHA membership increase will occur for the first time in over 23 years. Fees will go to \$550 per agency.
- Atlas has replaced the Instructor Network
 - Instructors will need to realign with their respective training sites.
- The Cardiac Arrest Summit will be held at the award-winning T in San Diego from Wednesday, November 29 through Saturday, December 2, with pre-conferences on Nov. 28 and 29. Register for the Cardiac Arrest Summit by visiting www.citizenpr.org/summit2023

State EMS Advisory Board

Beth Adams provided the following written report:

- Rules & Regulations Committee meeting (5/4/2023)
 - No quorum, so no votes were taken. Info/discussion only.
 - Still nothing re DEA rules change.
 - BOP planning a session re: CSR compliance @ symposium.
 - Local Board of Supervisors in SW Virginia voted down the Rescue Squad request to allow 13-year-olds to provide care.
- Executive Committee meeting (5/4/2023)
 - Approved Remote Participation & All Virtual Meeting policies.
 - Approved committee appointments for FARC, Health & Safety, Rules & Regs, Trauma.
 - Approved final draft Chapter 32 & Documents Included by Reference (DIBR) - aka EMS Rules & Regs.
 - Discussion re: Advisory Board composition
 - GAB’s position paper re: ED overcrowding & its impact on safe patient care was presented to the Board of Health (BOH) at their March meeting. The Board requested that VDH convene a stakeholder workgroup to include representatives from the Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association along with representatives from the VDH Office of Emergency Medical Services and the VDH Office of Licensure and Certification, to review the issues identified in the document and report back to the Board at the June 2023 meeting.
- Legislation & Planning Committee (5/5/2023)

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- General Assembly legislation we have been tracking:
 - *All have been signed by the Governor - effective 7/1/2023.*
 - HB1472/SB1246 EMS as an Essential Service
 - HB1447/SB1426 Admin. Of Drugs and Devices by EMS providers in medical facilities
 - HB1449 EMS Providers to Administer Prescription Medications to Patients under certain circumstances
- Workgroup established ref HB2175: Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security (the Secretary) shall establish a work group composed of representatives from the Department of Fire Programs, the Department of Planning and Budget, the Office of Emergency Medical Services, the Virginia Fire Services Council, Virginia's Regional EMS Councils, the Virginia Fire Chiefs Association, the Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations, the House Committee on Appropriations, and such other stakeholders as the Secretary deems appropriate to study existing fire service needs, analyze the sustainability of current funding, and review alternative funding models from other states. Report due by 10/1/2023.
- Presentation of the OEMS State Strategic Plan postponed to BOH September meeting.
- Advisory Board (5/5/2023)
 - Dr. Karen Shelton was selected to be the Commissioner of Health

 - Approved all action items forwarded from Exec Committee
 - Approved Remote Participation & All Virtual Meeting policies.
 - Approved committee appointments for FARC, Health & Safety, Rules & Regs, Trauma.
 - Approved final draft Chapter 32 & DIBR - aka EMS Rules & Regs.
 - Note: this moves Chapter 32 to Phase 2 of the regulatory process
 - Approved Trauma Committee recommendation to adopt the National Guideline for Field Triage.

Provider Health and Safety

Michelle Ludeman reported the following update:

- Last meeting was held on May 5th
- Committee membership is being updated and realigned to improve representation on the committee. Changes include:
 - Valerie Quick will serve as the DICO rep
 - Bubby Bish – VAVRS
 - Steven Powell – VAGEMSA
 - John Bianco – At Large
 - Bruce Stratton – At Large
 - Norma Williams - VPF
- Developing 2023/2024 goals and objectives for the committee
- Decedent Exposure process – has been finalized, and policy/testing kits will be pushed to regional councils soon.
- EMS Safety Officer – Discussion about developing this program to address EMS specific health and safety issues within the state. This would help us align data collection and other relevant

topics that are specific to EMS. Developing a draft position paper that is being reviewed within the committee.

- Discussion regarding the need to develop a consistent EMS LODD process that agencies across the state could use. This would include how and when to access state resources.

Medical PI Committee

Craig French reported the following update:

- April meeting
 - Lots of discussion on what direction to take for this meeting
 - This meeting conflicted with another EMS physician meeting, so there wasn't as good a turnout from EMS physicians as we'd hoped
 - The direction was decided to treat the Medical PI meeting like a journal club and share topics of interest
 - For the April meeting, the topic was hyperthermia emergencies and how EMS agencies handle them
 - Several people shared articles and materials on that
 - There was an athletic trainer and Nurse Practitioner from the Archdiocese of Arlington schools who discussed what their procedures are, and there was a good discussion on what happens when EMS arrives, and cooling procedures are already in place by the training staff
 - There was discussion on what methods agencies are using for cooling in these types of situations such as simply using a body bag filled with ice or another commercially produced cooling device
- The next meeting is July 12, and the topic is child welfare issues, specifically for situations for patients who are obtunded or too injured to care for the children in their care and how that's handled by EMS agencies and hospitals alike
- Kate Kramer will send out articles soon on the topic for discussion at our July meeting

Trauma PI Committee

Michelle Ludeman provided the following update:

- The Trauma PI Committee met yesterday
- The topic was pediatric trauma
 - Ages grouped as 0-5, 6-10, and 11-14
 - Gender
 - Type of injury (trauma, burns, etc.)
 - Transported via ambulance or medevac
 - How are those patients immobilized for transport, utilization of c-spine, and immobilization
 - Specifically for traumatic injuries in this age range, how are EMS agencies transporting other traumatic injuries safely in the back of the unit?
 - Any abnormal cases you may have encountered or findings that you would like to share
 - EMS Agencies: What is your approach to sending a parent with the child in the ambulance? Do you have a policy on this? Do you have a protocol for pediatric trauma transport considerations?
- The next meeting is scheduled for September 13, 2023, and the topic will be tourniquets, specifically looking at trends with tourniquets since we last visited the topic in December 2022.

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Medevac Committee

Rick Cohen advised that the last meeting was May 4th.

- This year, they are going to have a medevac track at Symposium
 - Not sure what that looks like just yet
 - They were missing a few lectures in the past but should have enough for this year

Patient Tracking Workgroup

Jamie Cooper provided the following update:

- They are no longer looking to move forward with Pulsara, and the workgroup is back to square one
 - They are regrouping and determining what the best route is at this point
- One advantage they have now is that there are additional vendors that were not available 22 months ago when they started this group

Regional Medical Directors & State Medical Direction Committee

Dr. Morgan provided the following update:

- The state medical direction committee last met on April 6th, so there is nothing new to report since our last update at the April Board meeting
- The next meeting will be July 13th

Training and Certification Committee

Michelle Ludeman provided the following report:

- Training and Certification last met in April, and there is no update since our last Board of Directors meeting
- The next meeting is July 12th

Workforce development

Byron Andrews provided the following report:

- Hight School EMT programs
 - There have been a lot of challenges between the Board of Education and OEMS on how they see the requirements and what needs to be laid out
- There will be a summit in July with OEMS and the Board of Education to try to work out some of the challenges they're experiencing
- Some programs are doing great, and others are not doing well at all. This is not due to instructors but due to school systems and the Board of Education
- The EMS Officer program is up and running, and since we're post-COVID more and more are becoming available
 - Chris Vernovai advised that they will do a class at Symposium, and there was an in-person class scheduled in Loudoun recently
- Standards of Excellence, if anyone is interested, this is a great way to recognize your organization
 - The City of Fairfax Fire Department successfully completed the Standards of Excellence and was recognized for that

City of Alexandria Fire Department

Kelsea Bonkoski gave the following update:

- They rolled out their RQI program this month and are through their first round with AHA
- They recently released three ALS interns
- There are 5 ALS to come out of internships in August
- They are going live with ESO in the fall, they just went on board

Arlington County Fire Department

Jason Jenkins provided the following update:

- Chief Anne Marsh retired in May
- Paul Earley has taken her place as EMS Battalion Chief
- They started a recruit school with 27 members
- They have nearly 20 ALS interns currently, which will be a big boost to the number of paramedics in the field

Beth Adams provided the following update:

- As of March, Jason Jenkins has gone to Arlington County FD
- They recently graduated students through the VCU course, and they'll start internships in September
- They graduated a recruit school recently with 1 or 2 ALS
- They continue exploring the EMS Specialist role in the department and associated challenges with positions, staffing, vehicles, etc.
- Dr. Weir advised of the following:
 - They are near implementing a new 4-tier dispatch EMD and will partner with neighboring for their awareness
 - Thanks to those who came to EMS Week Plus for the cadaver lab
 - It seems there was great fun and a good experience
 - There was a great turnout, and they hope to do it again

Fairfax County Police Helicopter Division

Paul DeHaven provided the following updates:

- They continue to adjust to the new facility
 - Since it's a LEED Certified building, it's taken a lot to get used to the lights turning on and off automatically, etc.
- Recently, 1 member of the team retired, and they recently went through the selection process
- They sent 2 members to EMT school to build up their reserves

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- They have 2 full-time SWAT members that just finished EMT school, so now they have 5 total on SWAT
- Brought new TAC medics from the helicopter division to augment the program
- They are celebrating 40 years of operation of the program
- They recently had a leadership change
 - Brian Bowman was the Chief Flight Officer and is now the Unit Commander
 - His replacement is Lance Hamilton, Second Lieutenant

Loudoun County Fire and Rescue

Jamie Cooper provided the following update:

- Rob Worley and Nicole Artiss presented to the Northern Virginia ED Managers Committee to discuss the Hospital Response Taskforce for an update in the Mass Casualty Incident Manual
 - There were several hospitals in the room or via Zoom, and the topic was well-received by all
 - They are moving forward with pursuing the Regional Hospital Response Taskforce Protocol. Please reach out to Jamie Cooper if you are interested
- Continue to roll forward with the AEMT program and now in 2nd iteration of the EMT to paramedic bridge
- Recruit schools
 - They recently had an abbreviated recruit school for those with certifications already, and it went better than they anticipated
 - They had a total of 9 ALS providers; 1 AEMT and 8 paramedics
 - They have another recruit school starting soon
 - Michelle Beatty advised that they currently have 35 recruits in now and they are in EMT school at this time
 - They will have a new recruit class of 35 in July
 - Both a recruit school and paramedic program are scheduled to start in August
- Dr. Morgan added that on June 4th, they had an interesting demonstration of the use of blood in the field because they used all 4 in 2 calls in a short time. One for trauma and one for medical.
 - He has been talking with VSP to get them back to having blood capabilities due to their severing with VCU's contract. They are interested in a relationship with IBDS.
- Jamie Cooper also added that they learned through the Virginia Board of Pharmacy that they will be impacted by Inova freestanding EDs can no longer restock CSKs. If you are in Loudoun County from another jurisdiction, this needs to be a consideration when transporting
- Ashburn, Cornwall, and Springfield will no longer restock as of July 3rd.

- They will have their next class in October
- They just had 1 finish their internship and have 2 more in the process

 - They had one new provider who was recently cut loose, and this was exactly what he needed
 - They would love to see those again in the future

- 16 paramedic students to graduate and start internships next week
- 18 more students registered for the next class will be VCU program, which will shorten their class time from 16 months to 12

Craig French advised that there was nothing to report

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- Adding to the previous discussion on the freestanding EDs not being able to exchange CSKs, no other drug exchanges will be affected
 - This is not just an Inova thing; this is all freestanding EDs

Reston Hospital Center

- As of June 3rd, the Tysons ED has been open a year and has been well-received by EMS. The public is starting to find them more often now
- For EMS week, they had an excellent turnout and tied in police week and had a great turnout for them as well
- There is a lot of construction and refreshing going on at the hospital right now
 - The ED will be in refresh mode for 9 months, slowly room by room and not all at once
- The EMS Communication area will be last
- They had a successful launch in Q4 with PW and AEC paramedic programs throughout the hospital, and they appreciate the partnership
- August 16th is the Virginia state review for their trauma certification
 - They will reach out to EMS to help with that.
- Trained recently trained 150 students on Stop the Bleed from the Criminal Justice program
- They are still doing monthly Trauma Grand Rounds. Keep an eye out for more information
- Finally, there was a big move. The pharmacy has moved to the other end of the hospital, and they are putting signs up directing folks to the new location in the hospital

- They were busy in May with medical escorts – when patient acuity/demand where patients go by ambulance, but they really need a patient health navigator and/or security. One went to Fairfax and 2 to Alexandria, and they both went seamlessly.
- Overall, there has been an uptick in violence against medical providers recently. This is the other reason they see traction on the security piece
- Responder Care – They raised \$10,000 in March, which is a required part of their sponsorship. Since then, donations are trickling in, but they are not campaigning for fundraising. The idea is not to provide acute care; they can, but they can do advanced provider consults and had 11 recently. Where this becomes of value is when a provider develops a disease, cancer, etc., and wants a paramedic they work with to be able to treat them, they can't under their affiliation. So, they can affiliate with them to provide care, and they can also do targeted fundraising for a particular provider

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- Doing some training soon on wound closure, ultrasound, etc.

They had a ride from Boston to DC and a southern route that came from SC to DC. There will be an honoree ride and a century ride down the W&OD trail.
