Call to Order

Council President Nate Strong welcomed all in attendance and called the meeting to order at 10:05 am.

- No representatives from the public were present to address the Board.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the NVEMSC Board of Directors held on October 13, 2023, were sent for review by email.

- Reed Smith made a motion to accept as written, seconded by Beth Adams
- The minutes were **unanimously approved**.

Treasurer's Report

The financial reports for October were sent via email for review.

- Beth Adams made a motion to approve the financials as submitted
- Kelsea Bonkoski seconded the motion
 - The financials were **unanimously approved**

President's Report

President Nate Strong had the following report:

- We are terminating our lease at the end of the calendar year. We have not yet found another space and will re-evaluate in six months.
- We will likely get a PO Box to collect mail until we find another location.

Executive Director's Report

Ray Whatley submitted the following report:

- We will be terminating our office lease soon. CFFD has offered us temporary office space at FS 403. We anticipate having a formal agreement soon. If any locality has potential office space, please contact us. We are required by our current contract to have a physical office.
- Our independent audit was completed and sent out. All deficiencies noted have been corrected, and additional checks and balances have already been incorporated.
- **OEMS Audit**
 - We completed our interview with the VDH Internal Auditors on November 6. The need to ensure funding EMS Councils was made clear by the Regional Executive Directors Group at the Advisory Board meeting on November 17. It was noted that some EMS Councils could cease to exist as early as this month or January without financial support of monies owed.
 - A partial payment invoice for FY 23 Q3 for \$50,000 was submitted to OEMS on December 5. Kevin Dillard stated that we should expect payment by Monday. Beth Adams and Andrew Slater will be serving on the workgroup.
- **ESO Contract**
 - WVEMSC will not renew the ESO contract. The last day of the contract will be early February. It may go month to month at that time.
 - Expect an RFP for data services from VDH/OEMS to be announced
 - Agencies that use the free OEMS ESO contracted services should plan to absorb those costs
 - No new agencies or hospitals can deploy HDE under the current contract
- **Vector Solutions** is in negotiations with PEMS and OEMS to terminate the contract. Providers should expect the free online CEU platform to be canceled.
- **Handtevy:** We were asked to see if the Inova Foundation would assist the career and volunteer agencies with a donation to cover 12/20/23 - 6/30/24. The initial quote is \$62,649, which includes a 50% discount for the initial setup fee and a 5% annual discount. Agencies that have already paid could be reimbursed, and for those that have not submitted payment, those invoices could be voided. NVERS is also looking into a regional contract.
- **EMS-Pharmacy Committee**
 - All agencies completed the CSK audit. The feedback was positive from the pharmacists.
 - A new Regional EMS Drug Dispensing form was approved by the EMS-Pharmacy committee. Changes include adding the following medications:
 - Acetaminophen 160mg/5mL suspension
 - Cefazolin 1g vial (requires 10mL SWFI) - Arlington
 - Droperidol 5mg/2ml - Arlington
 - Norepinephrine 8mg/250mL in D5W premix - Loudoun
 - Tranexamic acid 1g /100ml premix
 - The Virginia Regional Medication Kit Workgroup has been assembled with representatives from the Regional EMS Councils, the Virginia Office of EMS, the Virginia Board of Pharmacy, the Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association, the Virginia Society of Health Systems Pharmacists, the Virginia Association of Volunteer Rescue Squads, the Virginia Fire Chief's Association, and the Virginia Association of Governmental EMS Administrators. Gil Abernathy and Ray Whatley will serve on the committee from NVEMSC.
- **Regional Paramedic Program**
 - The CoAEMSP Letter of Review has been approved. Once all instructors are onboarded and agency MOUs are signed, a site review will be conducted. Ray is going through the process of becoming a DC EMS Instructor to support the program.

- **HB 2175 Report on the Commonwealth's Fire and EMS Service**
 - A report to the Virginia General Assembly on Virginia's fire and EMS funding and needs as required by House Bill 2175 (2023). The collaborative report was submitted by the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security to the Virginia General Assembly.
 - The workgroup recommends that the Virginia General Assembly consider multiple options to better protect citizens and assist localities with fire and EMS funding. Current funding is not sustainable for future growth in the Commonwealth. Direct funding for staffing in a program similar to VA 599 funding or the funding of sheriff's offices is recommended. Additionally, raising the amount of funding for the Fire Programs Fund, as well as the establishment of a staffing grant program would be beneficial. Other programs to consider include statewide equipment contracts and loan programs for fire departments and EMS agencies.
- Lastly, I want to publicly thank Laura, Michelle, and Margaret for their work on the annual report. Especially Laura, who consolidated and prepared it.

STATE AND REGIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

AHA Training Center

Ray Whatley submitted the following report:

- Prince William County has chosen to go with the American Red Cross and is no longer a training site as of December 1.
- Training sites now have the option for entrepreneurial instructors in good standing within the TC to purchase eCards directly from the Council, thereby eliminating the training sites from processing those rosters. This includes a different pricing structure than the actual training site.
- **Update to AHA eCards Technology: Use of Same Email Address for Multiple AHA eCards**
 - On October 18, 2023, technology updates were made to AHA eCards.Heart.org to remove the capability for a single, unique email to be used for multiple eCards. This update aligns AHA eCards technology with existing policy regarding the issuance and claiming of AHA eCards, which requires that each student has a unique email address to receive an AHA eCard.

Stroke Smart Update

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- There was one training session with the Fairfax Medical Reserve Corps earlier this week.

State EMS Advisory Board

Beth Adams provided the following written report:

- Rules & Regulations Committee (11/16/23)
 - Nothing yet from DEA.
 - Chapter 32 in Stage 2 of regulatory process – plan to present to Board of Health in Spring/Summer 2024.
 - Chapter 66 (Durable DNR) presentation to Board of Health pushed to December 2023
 - Routine periodic review – only style/format revisions
 - Due to decreased staff, ending automatic vehicle inspections for re-licensure, only new vehicles and/or new agencies will be inspected. All other vehicles are eligible for spot inspections 24/7/365.
- Executive Committee did not meet.
- Legislative & Planning Committee (11/17/23)
 - HB2175 –study re: funding & sustainability for fire & EMS was submitted to General Assembly & "sitting on Governor's desk."
 - Consensus fining: funding outstripped by costs.
 - Report from MDC: establishing work group to look at nomenclature for EMS physician & roles & nomenclature for PA/NP
 - Presentation by Dr. Joanne Lapetina re: concern that there is no return to practice pathway for impaired EMS providers like exists for other healthcare professionals.
 - Fire Council has not yet completed their 2024 legislative agenda.

Provider Health and Safety

Brian Frankel reported that there has been no meeting since the last report.

- They met regarding the decedent testing exposure process. The medical director subcommittee and regional councils will meet with Valerie on how to access the kits and what to do with them.
 - Discussion on access to after-hours test kits, whether those are maintained by the Councils or within the agencies, etc., and whether they can do blood draws internally depending on protocols.
- Doing some data collection on roadway safety data and asking the state epidemiologists to do some collection to determine the pathway for roadway safety for education in the future
- Discussions about mental health facilities and abilities for public safety responders across the state.
 - We are collecting information to make that available to providers.
 - HCA has a program, and there seems to be similar across the state
 - Forming two work groups – to clarify goals and objectives of health and safety so everyone knows what the mission is of the group, focused on EMS provider safety specifically
 - We are meeting in the next couple of weeks and should have more information by the end of January or early February
 - Another topic is infection control because of minor issues that keep coming about. If you're interested in participating, send info to Brian or the Council. He is happy to include people in the workgroup to keep infection control moving forward.
 - We are putting out a position paper to gauge the Board's interest in an EMS safety officer position in the state. NAEMT had the program a few years ago, and others have since followed – trying to get standardized EMS safety positions and what that looks like and training requirements.
 - They were approved for peer support programs to be accredited in the state. They continue to see an increase in those numbers, and it's great to see provider health awareness.

Medical PI Committee

There hasn't been another meeting since the last update in October.

Trauma PI Committee

Michelle Ludeman provided the following update:

- The next Trauma PI Meeting is scheduled for December 13, 2023.
- The topic is field amputations, and GW Hospitals Surgical Strike Team will present for the group on their process and what it took to get approvals, liability insurance, etc.

Medevac Committee

Rick Cohen advised of the following:

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- Discussion on using FirstNet in the air, which is technically illegal. Trying to work through the details to be used as an interoperability option

Patient Tracking Workgroup

Jamie Cooper provided the following update:

- Stalled currently
- Thanks to Adam Buckley & Julie Gall with NVERS for working with the committee to move forward
- There will be a presentation in front of NVERS next week
- Currently using GER for tracking vendor
- Due to last-minute changes with Pulsara, they have removed them as an option, mainly due to funding.
- They are back to square one, but additional resources were not available when they started this project last year.

Regional Medical Directors & State Medical Direction Committee

Dr. Morgan provided the following update:

- At the Regional Medical Directors meeting, there was a discussion regarding the Regional Stroke Plan being championed by Dr. Altaweel and the neuro intensivists. Several changes were made to the last approved plan. There was some misunderstanding that we do not have statewide or even regional protocols, and there were discussion points that the EMS physicians should be familiar with. Michelle sent the document to the OMDs for review after this meeting.

Training and Certification Committee

Michelle Ludeman provided the following report:

- **Regional EMS Councils** – Councils are working on identifying additional CE options for our providers. Council dates:
 - Rappahannock October 10-12
 - Central Shenandoah Mar 1-3 (Henrico Fire Training)
 - Central Shenandoah 8-10 (Chesterfield Co Fire Training)
 - Mar 14-17 (Blue Ridge Community Center)
 - NVEMS – March 4
- **Chad Blosser Reported:**
 - Education Coordinator Program
 - EC Institute – 30 educators approved from Virginia Beach Institute.
 - The mentorship program is producing quality candidates at each institute.
 - EC Institutes for future dates are published on the website.
 - EC Update – VFCA in February is the next potential update. Still to be determined. Check the website for other dates/locations.
 - Committee Positions opening this fiscal year for the Training & Certification Committee.
 - VAVRS
 - Regional Council
 - VCCS
 - Non-VCCS
 - Education Coordinator

- Debbie Akers reported:
 - NASEMSO AEMT SMC was disseminated and ultimately approved by TCC, MDC, and EMSGAB.
 - Letter sent to NREMT requesting to stop ALS Psychomotor testing early in Virginia. This was unable to be approved.
 - Before July 1, 2024 – Must take psychomotor testing.
 - On or after July 1, 2024 – Will be exempted from psychomotor testing.
 - July 1, 2025 – All candidates will be exempted from psychomotor testing regardless of the testing cycle.
 - AEMT examination should go computer adaptive on or after July 1, 2024.
 - ALS examinations will have dispatch, on-scene, and post-scene scenario-based questions. Currently, these are in beta but will be scored in the future.
 - Any AEMT course that starts on or after January 1, 2024, must adopt the NASEMSO AEMT SMC requirements.
 - QA/QI visits continue to take place. The biggest complaint is the arrival date, which was established based on the set TCPE date. The QA/QI visitor is only there to ensure TCPE is taking place and reviewing paperwork. They are not there to evaluate your TCPE process. This is required for all accredited and non-accredited EMR and EMT programs.
 - Accredited programs can give multiple competency testing dates unless you only use one day. If only one day, the QA/QI visit will occur then.
 - We are working on data from submitted EMT SMC documents.
 - If you look at the AEMT SMC, all are listed in ranges for each patient and condition/complaint type.
 - Course approvals – as all of you are aware, Tracy retired. Debbie now handles all course approvals. Please plan accordingly and submit your courses early for processing and approval.
 - As all are aware, the Symposium was canceled. They are pleased that the Regional Councils are stepping up to offer CE opportunities. They have a webpage showing all the CE opportunities provided to the Office. The VFCA will be offering an EMS track during their February 2024 conference.
 - They are planning for the 2024 EMS Symposium. They are working to reach out to locations for bids for the future Symposium location.

Workforce Development

Byron Andrews provided the following update:

- During their recent meeting, they discussed the EMS officer program and Excellence in EMS as part of the restrictions, as those programs were cut due to funding. They will allow the jurisdictions to hold those classes if they want to.
- There were recently three inspections for the EMS Excellence program. Those were in Winchester, Roanoke, and Virginia Beach.
 - This program is slowly being brought back up.

OLD BUSINESS

Bylaw Committee

- They will have a meeting in January, and some people have stepped forward, but if anyone is interested, please notify the Council.

CARES Registry

- In December 2020, the NVEMSC Board of Directors approved funding of the CARES registry fees to cover the regional cost. Last year, OEMS paid for it, but due to the current internal audit and investigations, they will not cover the fee.
 - Do we want to continue to use it? It will be \$6000 for the year.
 - Motion – Beth Adams motioned to continue maintaining the contract with the CARES Registry and for the Council to pay for it again this year.
 - Andrew Hopkins seconded the motion.
 - The motion was **unanimously approved**.

JURISDICTIONAL REPORTS

City of Alexandria Fire Department: Assistant Fire Chief Andrew Duke reports

- Chief Smedley is Retiring on January 12, 2024
- Ten staff attending Paramedic School
- Recruit school in session with 17 recruits
- The hiring process for the EMS Deputy Chief is underway

City of Fairfax Fire Department: Battalion Chief Brian Orndoff reports

- There is nothing to report from the City of Fairfax.

Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department: Deputy Chief Lee Warner reports

- We will be implementing an EMS Specialist position in January 2024. This will be an advanced practice paramedic operating as a single provider. There are only three personnel, and they will be working a 0700-1900 role several days a week in a trial position. Their CAD designators will be ALS401, 402, and 403.
- We also anticipate reclassifying 8 ALS transport units from ALS to BLS in January 2024. This will adjust our EMS transport platform to 23 ALS and 20 BLS units.

City of Manassas Park Fire and Rescue Department: Deputy Chief Adam Jones reports

- We finished the in-house EMT class, and the EMTs are currently completing their written testing.
- With the current environment of Medic shortages and an increase in EMS calls, we have been discussing what an additional transport unit would look like for Manassas Park, simply in the discussions phase.
- Continued working with Prince William and Manassas City on EMS call typing.

Loudoun County Combine Fire and Rescue System: Deputy Chief Jamie Cooper

- Please see an email sent from Dr. Morgan regarding Virginia's "Schedule VI laws" at the end of the reports.
- Also, Loudoun has completed a 2.5-month Critical Care Certification class. 8 of the 11 enrolled were successful with their initial Board examination. This brings our total number of certified critical care paramedics to 31.
- We are ¾ through our second AEMT to Paramedic upgrade, in which we expect to net nine new Paramedics. Two other Paramedics should complete their precepting process by the end of January.

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- We are also ¾ through our current AEMT class. This class was focused on a night/weekend schedule to support our volunteer providers. However, we also enrolled 3 LCFR career EMTs. One additional career AEMT is in the precepting process.
- Planning continues to significantly upgrade our academy facilities, including a purpose-built Firehouse style academy, a new five-story Training Tower, renovation of the existing legacy building and annex, a new extrication pad, and replacement of the current flashover simulator.
- Loudoun intends to stay with Stryker as the supplier of our cardiac monitors and is planning a system-wide purchase of 73 new LP35 monitors upon introduction to the market.
- We will also upgrade our existing ultrasound capacity from the Butterfly version 1 POCUS to the Butterfly version 3 this spring.

NVCC College: Kathleen Deal reports

- Fall Semester ends 12/12/23.
- College closed to business 12/23/23-1/2/24.
- Spring Semester begins 1/16/24.
- NREMT ALS Psychomotor exams end 6/30/2024 – only cognitive exams after 7/1/24 – Accredited programs are to conduct Terminal Skills Testing within the program curriculum.

Schedule VI security discussion

At the October 5, 2023, Medical Direction Committee meeting, the topic of Virginia regulations regarding the security of "Schedule VI" medications and supplies was discussed.

Specifically, it was noted that most of the surrounding states have different practices as it pertains to the regulation and security/storage of those prescription medications (and supplies) that are not regulated by the federal Controlled Substances Act (CSA). The CSA regulates Schedule I through V. In many other states, basic prescription medications and supplies are not secured in any special manner compared to other equipment/supplies on the ambulance. Many 911 agencies in Virginia have historically partnered with hospital-based pharmacies who have borne much of the regulatory requirements. The practices of medication exchange are currently under review with potential new regulations from DEA which may impact practices moving forward. As 911 EMS agencies plan for potential future changes in medication ordering and storage, there may be an opportunity for stakeholders to collaborate on opportunities to improve regulations as they pertain to EMS in the Commonwealth.

The Virginia code that defines Schedule VI is § 54.1-3455.

As a result of the Virginia regulations, there may exist an administrative burden and expenses with associated costs required to comply with regulations on:

- Monthly inventories of all controlled substances (including schedule VI)
- Disposal of expired schedule VI through an authorized disposal entity
- Maintenance of records/transactions involving schedule VI medications and supplies for specific time periods
- Security such as camera/alarm systems

The level of security for schedule VI medications and supplies creates challenges in EMS vehicles and stations making compliance with existing regulations difficult and potentially impeding patient care. Examples follow:

- Up until 2023 when naloxone became an OTC medication, agencies were advised they could not store this life-saving medication in a forward-deployed (but less secured) manner such as in an EMS aid bag. This was despite non-EMS entities such as law enforcement and many others in the community having naloxone stored in this less secure fashion for ease of access in emergency.
- An ambulance in station may store schedule VI medications and supplies within the vehicle but if that vehicle goes out of service (repair etc), those medications/supplies cannot move to be stored in a secured station cabinet without a separate pharmacy license for the station. Given the large number of facilities (fire stations), this becomes an unrealistic regulatory requirement.
- Large Schedule VI medical equipment such as a cardiac monitor/defibrillator is stored in ambulances and cannot practically be treated with the security requirements that Virginia regulations require.

Prioritizing security of medications regulated by the Federal CSA is important and may be a more valuable focus for EMS agencies and BOP's efforts and expenses.

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There exist exemptions in Virginia code for certain entities, this could potentially be expanded to unburden EMS agencies:

18VAC110-20-710 Requirements for storage and security for controlled substances registrants.

An alarm system is not required for researchers, animal control officers, humane societies, alternate delivery sites as provided in 18VAC110-20-275, emergency medical services agencies stocking only intravenous fluids with no added drug, persons authorized by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services to train individuals on the administration of naloxone and to dispense naloxone for opioid overdose reversal, and teaching institutions possessing only Schedule VI drugs.

The Guidance Document 110-41 Virginia Board of Pharmacy Emergency Medical Services Drug Kits is also an important reference on this subject. Though this is a "guidance" document, there are multiple references to code and much of this guidance is codified.
